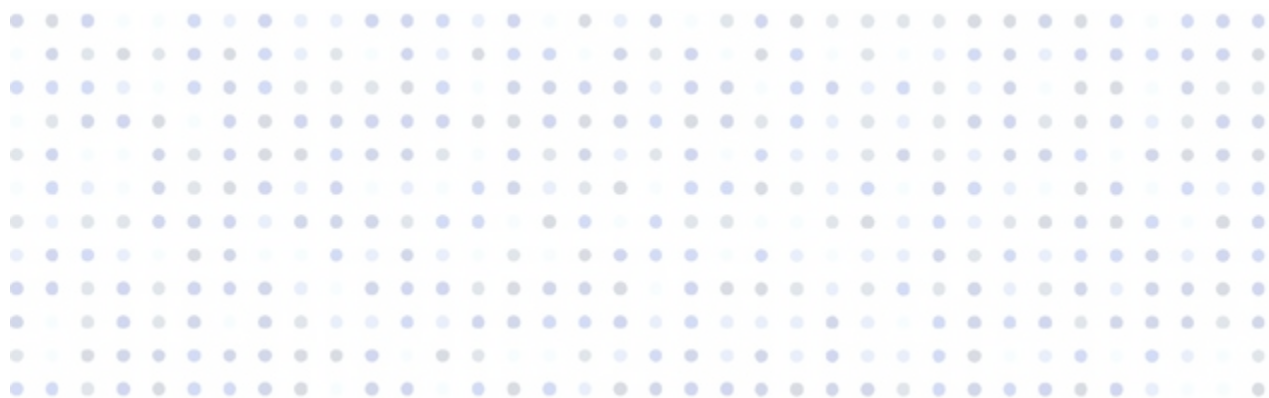



SUMMARY

Challenge Hunger is a month-long campaign in March aimed at raising awareness and collecting donations to help "Challenge Hunger" in our local communities. In 2023, the Hall Foundation matched donations up to \$50,000. All proceeds were donated to local food banks wherever the money was raised.

- Good 2 Go store associates asked customers to donate \$0.50 at checkout.
- 11 Brad Hall Companies offices hosted a lunch for employees and encouraged them to donate their lunch money via Venmo, Zelle, or PayPal.
- Several offices invited customers, friends, family, and co-workers to get involved by donating money or canned goods.
- Multiple employees through the companies volunteered at local food banks & soup kitchens in their areas.
- Brad Hall Companies employees in Idaho Falls, Idaho visited United Way and put together Spring Break food kits for 400+ children in local schools.

SUMMARY

Dozens of Senergy Petroleum and Teton Petroleum Transport employees teamed up to participate in Pat's Run. The race honors Pat Tillman, an NFL football player who enlisted in the army but was killed in the line of duty in 2002. Funds raised from the race support the Pat Tillman Foundation which provides military veterans and their spouses academic scholarships.

- Employees walked, jogged, & ran 4.2 miles along the streets of Tempe in support of the cause.
- They hosted a booth in Racers' Village to promote Senergy Petroleum & Teton Petroleum Transport to over 19,000 participants in the run.

The Hall Foundation launched Service September in 2023 to provide opportunities for employees of Brad Hall Companies to get together with their co-workers to propose service ideas that would benefit their communities. The proposals were submitted to & approved by the Hall Foundation committees, who then worked with employees to provide funding and resources for their projects.

Employees' service projects were completed during paid work hours. Throughout the month, we shared the inspiring stories of service, highlighting the incredible efforts of our employees.

PROJECTS | ARIZONA



PHOENIX, AZ | SCHOOL SUPPLIES KITS:

Employees stuffed 191 backpacks with school supplies. The backpacks were donated to underprivileged children in South Phoenix. This project was in coordination with the Arizona Guide Right Foundation and the Phoenix Alumni Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi.



PHOENIX, AZ | WINTER KITS:

Employees assembled 780 kits for the homeless that included: a hat, gloves, socks, hand warmers, ChapStick, mints, snacks, and water. Employees took the kits with them to pass out from their trucks or vehicles when they see a need in their community.



PHOENIX, AZ | PET PARTY & SHELTER DAY:

The Foundation hosted a pet supply donation event. A small group of employees volunteered and donated the items to the Arizona Humane Society. The Foundation purchased \$500 worth of pet supplies for the Pinal County Animal Shelter.



GILBERT, AZ | UNITED WAY "DAY OF SERVICE":

Employees rotated through 3 service projects: snack packs, mindfulness kits, and book bags. Completed projects/ supplies were donated to local schools.

GILBERT, AZ | MANUELITO COMMUNITY QUILTS:

Senergy employees received no-sew quilt kits that were completed and donated to families on the Navajo Nation. Teton Petroleum Transport took the gifts to Lupton Petroleum, where they were distributed to the community.



BISBEE, AZ | WOMEN'S SHELTER CHRISTMAS:

The Hall Foundation purchased \$1,500 worth of needed items. Good 2 Go employees sorted, packaged, and delivered the items.



MESA, AZ | THE GIFT OF READING:

The Hall Foundation purchased 2 bookshelves, which were assembled by employees. Employees also donated new or gently used books for children, age 5 and under. The Foundation added to the books and purchased a few toys, a rug, and pillows to create an entire reading corner at the foster center.



SUPERIOR, AZ | "STAY COOL" KITS:

Employees at Good 2 Go Store 515 in Superior, AZ handed out 1000 neck cooling towels and water to festival goers at the Prickly Pear Festival. The remaining water was given to the local community sporting programs. The Foundation donated \$500 to the Superior Food Bank to help with their upcoming Thanksgiving meal.

DOUGLAS, AZ | FOOD BANK CHRISTMAS MEAL:

The Foundation donated \$1,500 to St. Vincent de Paul's Food Bank. Employees helped serve a holiday meal to those in need.

IDAHO FALLS, ID | HYGIENE KITS:

Just 4 Kids Urgent Care employees from the Idaho Falls clinic got together to assemble 150 hygiene kits for local children.



IDAHO FALLS, ID | ANIMAL SHELTER PROJECTS:

Several employees of Brad Hall Companies built dog ramps, a catio enclosure, and a bridge for the Snake River Animal Shelter. This equipment helped make the stay for dogs & cats at the shelter more enjoyable. The equipment also provided a better way to showcase the animals to enhance their probability of being adopted.



IDAHO FALLS, ID | IDAHO PERIOD PROJECT KITS:

Employees from Brad Hall Companies stuffed 2,178 packs for The Idaho Period Project. The Idaho Period Project's mission is to ensure access to free, easily accessible period products for Idaho K-12 public and charter school students.



IDAHO FALLS, ID | MEALS FOR THE HOMELESS:

Payroll and several other employees from HQ helped a local group in Idaho Falls cook, clean up, and serve lunch to just over 500 people in need. In addition, the Hall Foundation donated \$500 to help purchase supplies.

IDAHO FALLS, ID | TREE PLANTING:

The Accounting, Legal, and Human Resources Departments from Brad Hall Companies teamed up to plant 51 trees at the Tiger Athletic Complex in Idaho Falls. This complex will benefit youth sports and promote healthy lifestyles in Idaho Falls and surrounding community for many years to come.



BLACKFOOT, ID | SCHOOL SUPPLIES DRIVE:

Bingham Ag Services employees organized a drive to gather backpacks and school supplies for over 300 foster children in Southeast Idaho.



IDAHO FALLS, ID | HYGIENE KITS:

LP Propane assembled 100 hygiene kits that were distributed to children in need in the American Falls school district. They have 300 unhoused children in their school district, so these kits were greatly needed & appreciated.



POCATELLO, ID | VETERANS' CHRISTMAS SHOP:

The Foundation helped host American Legion Auxiliary Unit Christmas shop for residents of the Idaho State Veterans' Home. This allowed the residents to "shop" for gifts for family members without the need to leave the facility, along with gift wrapping services. Items in the Christmas Shop were donated to the residents at no cost.

POCATELLO, ID | HEALTH & HAPPINESS EXTRAVAGANZA:

Just 4 Kids Urgent Care hosted a Health & Happiness Extravaganza. to encourage families to be more proactive in their health. They organized a Teddy Bear Clinic, offered raffles & games, and provided a free first aid kit to the first 500 families.

LAS VEGAS, NV | WINTER KITS:

Teton Petroleum Transport employees & their families assembled 780 kits for the homeless that included: a hat, gloves, socks, hand warmers, ChapStick, mints, snacks, and water. Employees took the kits with them to pass out from their trucks or vehicles when they see a need in their community.



PROVO, UT | HOSPITAL QUILTS & DONATIONS:

Senergy Petroleum employees tied 20 quilts and made a wreath that was on display at the Festival of Trees. The quilts and the profits from the wreath were donated to Primary Children's Hospital.

GOOD 2 GO | PEANUT BUTTER DRIVE:

Good 2 Go stores throughout the Western United States collected donations for the purchase of peanut butter. They raised \$3,289, which purchased 1,954 jars of peanut butter! The Hall Foundation matched every jar of peanut butter with a jar of jelly. All jars were sent to the nearest food bank, where the donations were collected.

WALL OF WARMTH

WALL OF WARMTH

SUMMARY

The Wall of Warmth made a significant impact in East Idaho by collecting & giving away over 6,000 coats!

Community members were invited to contribute new or gently used coats between Oct 10th & Nov 22nd, utilizing 1 of 54 designated drop-off boxes scattered throughout East Idaho. Nov 14th to Nov 25th, the Walls of Warmth were up, offering free coats to anyone who needed them. Brad Hall Companies employees organized & hung the donated coats on the Wall of Warmth fences in each location. Due to the increased demand for coats this year, each time the Walls of Warmth were stocked, it only took a day or two before they were empty again. Many people were so grateful to have a place to pick up coats for their friends & families for winter.

- This collaborative project spread warmth to 8 East Idaho communities. In 2023, the project expanded its reach by adding 3 new Walls of Warmth, making it easier for the public to access the coats.



GIVING TREE



SUMMARY

In 2023, the Hall Foundation identified employees who could use a lift this holiday season through manager referrals. Co-workers generously purchased gifts from the virtual Giving Tree to help provide a “need” & “want” for 55 of our employee’s children.

- Employees at Bingham Ag, LP Propane, and Senergy Petroleum in Blackfoot, ID helped provide Christmas for several families at the local crisis center. They also helped provide much needed items at Snake River Middle School. These funds used to purchase items came from Bingham Ag’s “Round Up” program. Customers at the Bingham Ag Stores were offered a round up on their purchase to help those in need. The final round up amount was matched with funds from the Hall Foundation.
- American Falls School District benefited from an in-person Giving Tree at Bingham Ag Services where employees took tags from the trees and provided school supplies, clothing items, meal kits, blankets, pillows & other essential items. They also purchased items for the Crisis Center in Aberdeen.
- Senergy employees in Gilbert & Phoenix, AZ recognized a need in the Manuelito Community & organized a “Sub for Santa” service event. Employees shopped for & purchased the requested needs. Phoenix employees sorted & wrapped the items. The Hall Foundation donated approximately \$5,500 toward the event.
- In Idaho Falls, Brad Hall Companies employees played the role of Santa’s helpers. They went shopping to purchase needed items for local School Districts #91 & #93 and delivered those items to the district offices.





EDUCATION

The Hall Foundation provides education scholarships to online international students from 56 different countries. The scholarship recipients receive full tuition, books, and fees. Education opens the door of opportunity, which leads to better employment, and stability for families.

- Served a Full-time mission for the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints.
- Completed BYU-Pathway Worldwide's foundational PathwayConnect program and be admitted to an online degree program from BYU-Idaho or Ensign College.
- Currently living outside the United States & Canada.

TO REMAIN ELIGIBLE, EACH STUDENT MUST...

- Submit transcripts each semester that shows 2.0 cumulative GPA or better.
- Fill out each end of semester survey.

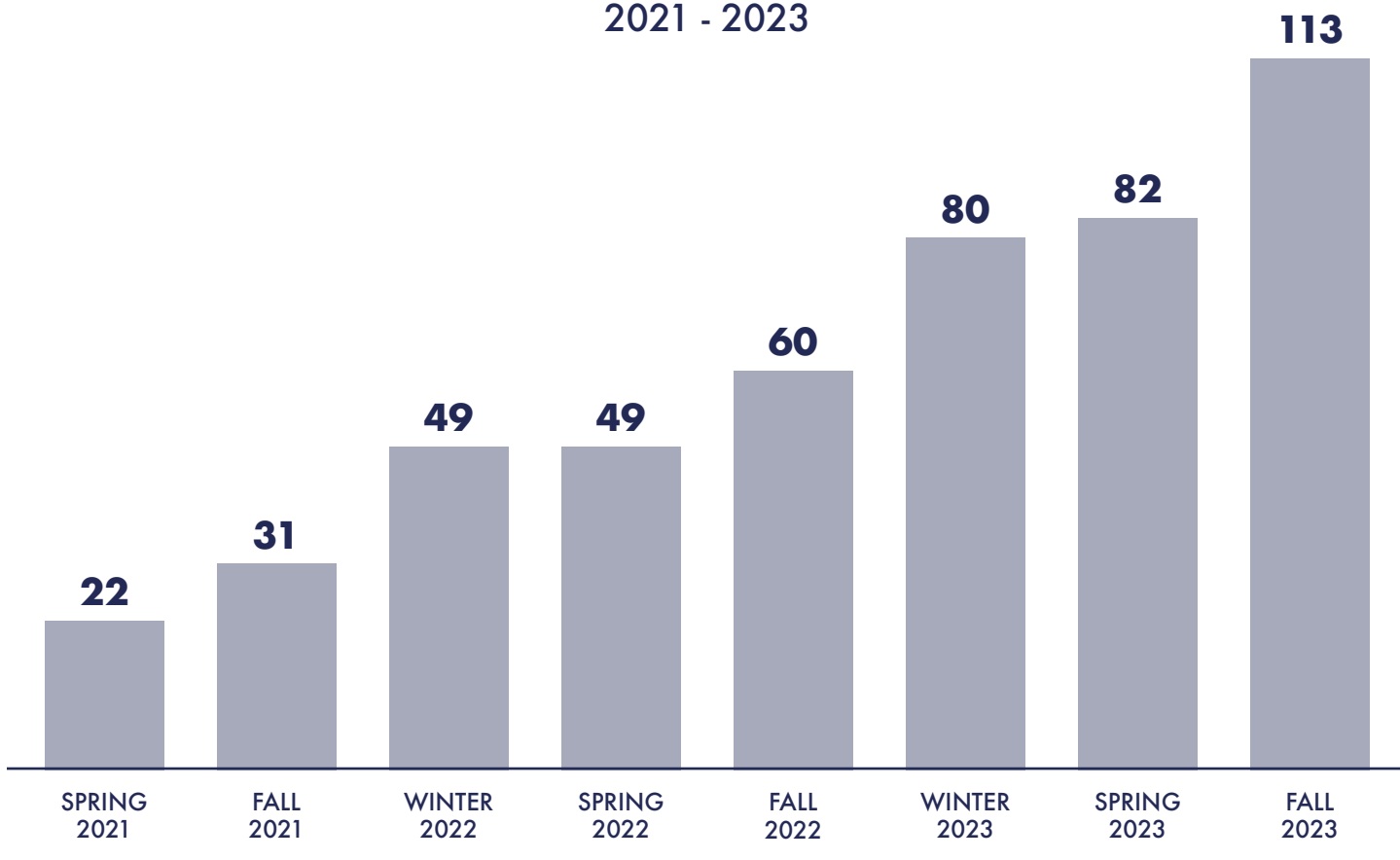
