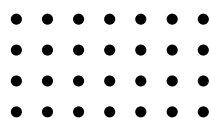

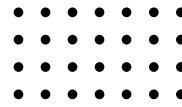
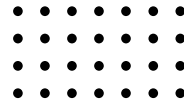

Dear Donors & Volunteers:

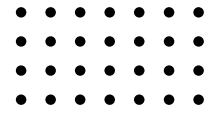

Challenge Hunger



March brought another successful **Challenge Hunger** campaign, a month-long effort aimed at raising awareness and collecting donations to fight hunger in our local communities. In 2024, the Hall Foundation once again matched donations up to \$50,000, doubling the impact of every dollar raised. Thanks to the generosity of our customers, employees, and partners, we raised an incredible **\$56,668.24** to support local food banks.

Good 2 Go Stores Round Up at the Pump

This year, a key change came with the introduction of a "round-up at the pump" option at Good 2 Go stores, allowing even more patrons to join the cause. Here's how the funds came together:

Good to Go had an increase of \$22,679 compared to 2023, and Bingham Ag had an increase of \$13,498.

*With the Hall Foundation's \$50,000 match, the campaign raised a total of **\$106,668.24** for food banks in our communities.*



We cannot end hunger, but we can challenge it!

In Arizona, our Challenge Hunger campaign included a friendly competition. Senergy Petroleum and Teton Petroleum Transport came together for the *Battle of the Peanut Butter*. Employees donated more than **1,000 jars of peanut butter** to their local food banks. The Gilbert and Mesa offices of Senergy took the lead with **418 jars**, earning them the coveted trophy, lunch, and bragging rights. Senergy's Phoenix office came in a close second with **377 jars**, and offices in Provo, Salt Lake City, and Tucson donated **180 jars**, securing third place.

Because peanut butter isn't complete without jelly, the Hall Foundation stepped in to provide the necessary funds for local food banks to pair the peanut butter with jelly. Congratulations to everyone who participated, you made the *Battle of the Peanut Butter* a success!

In the Pocatello, ID area, Just 4 Kids employees assembled 100 Spring Break kits filled with food to ensure children in need had something to eat during the break.

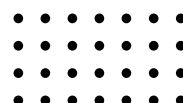
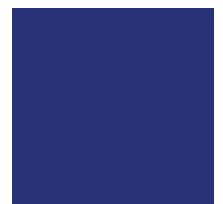
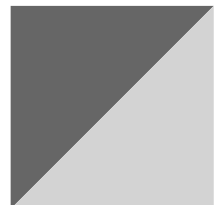
Thanks to a \$10,000 donation from the Hall Foundation, United Way was also able to provide Spring Break food kits for over 400 children in Idaho Falls, ID.



Feed My Starving Children

In addition to supporting local food banks, the Hall Foundation partnered with *Feed My Starving Children (FMSC)*, an organization committed to ending hunger worldwide by providing life-saving meals to children in need. Every year, millions of children die from preventable causes such as undernutrition, which accounts for nearly half of all deaths in children under five.

Thanks to the hard work and dedication of our employees, the Hall Foundation was able to donate **\$15,000** to FMSC. Our commitment extended even further, when **539 Brad Hall Companies employees and their families** volunteered their time and energy at an FMSC meal-packing event. Together, they hand-packed an astounding **108,864 meals**, which will provide nourishment for **298 children in Africa for an entire year**.



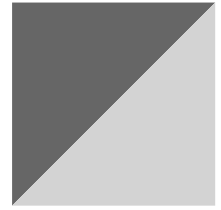
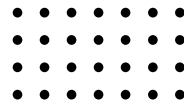

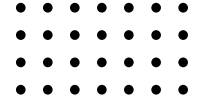
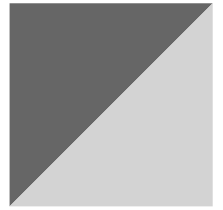
The Hall Foundation donated \$10,000 to the American Red Cross.

9/11 Day of Service | Senergy Petroleum

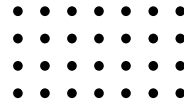
Phoenix, AZ

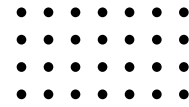

The Village: Idaho Foster & Adoptive Parent Association:

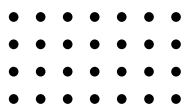
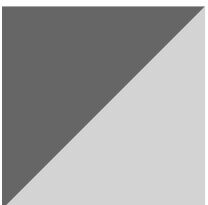

Shop With a Cop:

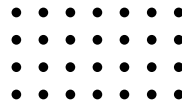
The Hall Foundation proudly sponsored the Shop with a Cop event in Idaho Falls with a \$1,000 donation. This annual event pairs local law enforcement officers with children ages 5 to 12 who would benefit from a positive experience with police. The day begins with a shared breakfast where each child is paired with an officer. They then ride together—lights and sirens flashing—to the store, where they spend the next hour or two shopping. Each child, with the officer's help, selects and purchases gifts for their immediate family members.

Greater Idaho Falls Police Foundation:

The Greater Idaho Falls Police Foundation supports the community through programs like Community Care, which allows officers to assist individuals in need by providing essentials such as food, fuel, and clothing—without using their own money. The Hall Foundation donated \$5,000 to help fund this program and support vital officer training, including in-house sessions, conferences, and distance learning beyond what tax-funded budgets cover.

East Idaho came together to spread the warmth! The Wall of Warmth returned for 2024, kicking off a week earlier to ensure no one was left out in the cold. As winter approached, the community rallied to help each other stay warm throughout the chilly months.

What is the Wall of Warmth? Valorie Blanchard, local realtor, started the Wall of Warmth in 2017. It began with one small wall and a big idea: to give back to the community. Now in its eighth year, that one wall has grown into an incredible ten walls in eight communities, including Pocatello, Blackfoot, Shelley, Idaho Falls, Rigby, Rexburg, St. Anthony and Driggs. With the help of the Hall Foundation, JustServe, and several local businesses, we collected **6,000+ coats** for those in need.

From **October 1 to November 13**, the community was invited to **donate** clean, gently used coats and winter gear at any local Good 2 Go Store or one of **64** other drop-off boxes located throughout East Idaho. Whether it's a coat, snow pants, hats, gloves or scarves, every item donated helped someone stay warm this winter.

Between **Nov 4 – Nov 16** the Wall of Warmth coats were set up on fences in communities throughout East Idaho. Individuals were encouraged to take what they need for themselves, family, or friends.
