INTERNATIONAL STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

Education remains at the heart of the Hall Foundation's work. In 2025, our scholarship program supported students from 74 countries across six continents. This year marked a major milestone as **106 Hall Foundation scholarship recipients earned Bachelor of Science degrees**. Their accomplishments reflect perseverance, determination, and hard work—and affirm why these scholarships exist; a belief in the students' potential and their ability to make a meaningful impact around the world.

Scholarship Reach and Impact

- **4,500+** full-tuition scholarships awarded since the program began
- **106** Bachelor of Science degrees earned in 2025
- **74** countries represented
- **43%** are women
- **38%** students with children

While these outcomes reflect growth and success, this year also required resilience. In 2025, Hall Foundation scholarship recipients faced significant change as BYU-Pathway Worldwide transitioned to a new information system, leading to registration and payment disruptions. At the same time, courses shifted from full semesters to seven-week blocks, requiring students to quickly adapt to a faster academic pace. Throughout it all, students stayed committed and placed their trust in the Hall Foundation, as we ensured tuition was covered and support remained consistent.



CHALLENGE HUNGER

Each March, the Hall Foundation unites employees, customers, and community partners through Challenge Hunger to raise awareness, provide meals, and support food banks. While the Foundation typically sets aside up to \$50,000 to match donations, in 2025 we provided a true dollar-for-dollar match which delivered **record-breaking results**. We raised **\$73,922.49** during the campaign. With a total of **\$147,844.98** donated after a full Hall Foundation match.



Hands-On Service for Hunger Relief

Global Impact- Feed My Starving Children

In addition to supporting local food banks, the Hall Foundation partnered with *Feed My Starving Children (FMSC)*, an organization committed to ending hunger worldwide by providing life-saving meals to children in need. Every year, millions of children die from preventable causes such as undernutrition, which accounts for nearly half of all deaths in children under five.

Thanks to the hard work and dedication of our employees. Our commitment extended even further, when **539 Brad Hall Companies employees and their families** volunteered their time and energy at an FMSC meal-packing event. Together, they hand-packed an astounding **108,864 meals**, which will provide nourishment for **298 children in Africa for an entire year**.

STEP CHALLENGE & BLOOD DRIVE

Stepping Up & Saving Lives

In 2025, employees across the enterprise made a powerful impact through the Hall Foundation Step Challenge and Blood Drives.

Together, we walked **51 million steps**, turning movement into mission and donating **\$12,500** to support four incredible charities:

- **Friends of the Children:** Pairs youth facing major challenges with a dedicated mentor for 12+ years
- **Pets for Patriots:** Supports U.S. military veterans and shelter animals through companion pet adoption
- **American Red Cross:** Provides emergency relief and lifesaving blood donations
- **National Association of Free & Charitable Clinics (NAFC):** Delivers quality healthcare to underserved communities

The efforts didn't stop there. The Hall Foundation Blood Drives collected **71 units of blood**, enough to potentially save **up to 213 lives**.


PACKING FOR SUCCESS

Bingham Ag Services: Supporting Foster Children

Bingham Ag employees filled **400 backpacks** with school supplies for foster children at the Village in Blackfoot. The Village, a foster care closet run by the Idaho Foster & Adoptive Parent Association, serves children across 16 Southeastern Idaho counties. With support from the Hall Foundation, these backpacks helped these kids feel prepared and ready to learn.

One Senergy Week

During One Senergy Week, 75 Senergy employees from eight offices across four states assembled 864 backpacks filled with school supplies for students at Estancia Municipal, Barney Ford, JFK Academy of Inquiry, Bonneville Elementary, Concordia Charter, and Salvavision Refugee Center. Transforming Freeman Park



Wall of Warmth 2025: Bringing Warmth and Kindness to East Idaho

The Wall of Warmth returned for its ninth year, bringing communities together to share coats and winter gear with those who need it most. From **November 10–21, 2025**, walls were set up in eight communities across East Idaho, supporting families and individuals in need. Brad Hall Companies employees and local volunteers organized, hung, and maintained the walls.

New this year:

Local school counselors and agencies supporting families and individuals in need had early access to the walls, allowing them to distribute coats to community members who could not visit in person.

Honoring Valorie Blanchard

The Wall of Warmth began in 2017 as a small act of service by realtor Valorie Blanchard. 2025 marked her final year leading the project, and the community honored her dedication and vision.

Valorie reflects:

"In 2017, I started the Wall of Warmth with just one wall, a handful of coats, and a big dream to give back to the community I love so much. Since then, Wall of Warmth has grown into something much bigger than I ever imagined. We now have nine walls across East Idaho, thousands of coats are donated every year, and so many lives are touched in beautiful ways. This project has been one of the most meaningful parts of my life. I've seen incredible things: people finding coats for loved ones, volunteers showing up in snowstorms, and kids hanging up their own jackets just so they could help another child stay warm. 


